

If someone you know has been accessing indecent images of children online what can you do?



When confronted with this behaviour, most people initially feel anger, shock and confusion – or just numbness. This is quickly followed by urgent questions about how this will affect their family, their relationships, their job – and how they are going to cope with the legal process, the possible media interest and the potential stigma. Almost everyone has a need to know what is likely to happen next.

You can talk to us

Knowing who you can talk to is the first step in getting the right help and support. **The Lucy Faithfull Foundation (LFF)** is a leading child protection charity working to prevent the sexual abuse of children. We work with people who have sexually harmed, or fear they may harm a child, including those who commit offences on the Internet. We also work with their families and those close to them, to help them address the questions and issues the behaviour has raised.

The **Inform programme** is a course for partners, relatives and friends of anyone who has been accessing indecent images of children online. It offers a safe space in which people who are struggling with the emotional and practical impact of Internet offending can bring their questions and anxieties and begin to explore them in a supportive environment.

Each group typically has up to six members, who meet for five evening sessions. The group is led by a specialist LFF staff member and aims to:

- Dispel myths about Internet offending and provide you with the facts
- Explore questions such as:- 'what made him do it?' and 'why didn't he stop?'
- Consider practical issues including the implications of sentencing outcomes and the Sex Offenders' Register
- Help you devise practical strategies to plan for the future, including ongoing risk management
- Provide emotional support to help you cope and alleviate feelings of stress and isolation
- Enhance your ability to aid your own, and your family's, recovery
- The information you share will remain confidential unless it raises concerns about a child at risk.

If you cannot attend one of our group programmes, it may be possible for us to deliver this programme on a one-to-one basis. Please contact our office on 01372 847160 for more details.

How much does *Inform* cost?

Inform groups and one-to-one programmes cost £700-£800 to run. We encourage donations from participants of £150+ to help contribute to the cost of the course and these contributions are very much appreciated. These donations are eligible for gift aid, so if you are a UK tax payer, we can also claim an extra 25% from the Government. Charitable funding helps make up the difference.
