

Constabulary Year to Date

Volume of All Searches: In the three month reported on Aug, Sept, Oct, 2019 there have been 513 searches have taken place. This is compared to 378 which were conducted in the same period in 2018.

As stated above the arrest rate, which can be seen as a marker of success, has decreased to 14.22% (FYTD) compared to 22.27% the previous year and 19.79% in 2017/2018.

The percentage of searches resulting in a positive outcome has dropped by 10%, from 32.75% to 22.61%.

Year on Year comparable: 2018/2019 of 32.75%, 2017/2018 of 28.15% and 2016/2017 of 21.30% (FYTD).

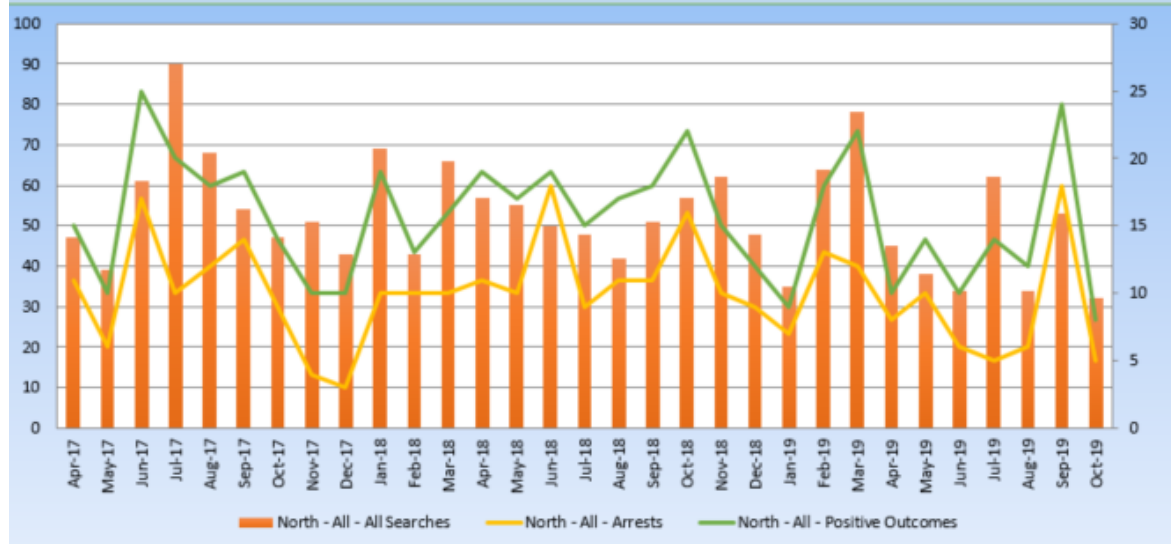
Within force, the percentage of Positive Outcomes matching reason for search fell from 73%, to 69%. This position usually maintains between 73% - 74% and although positive, this will continue to be monitored recognising a need for continuous improvement.

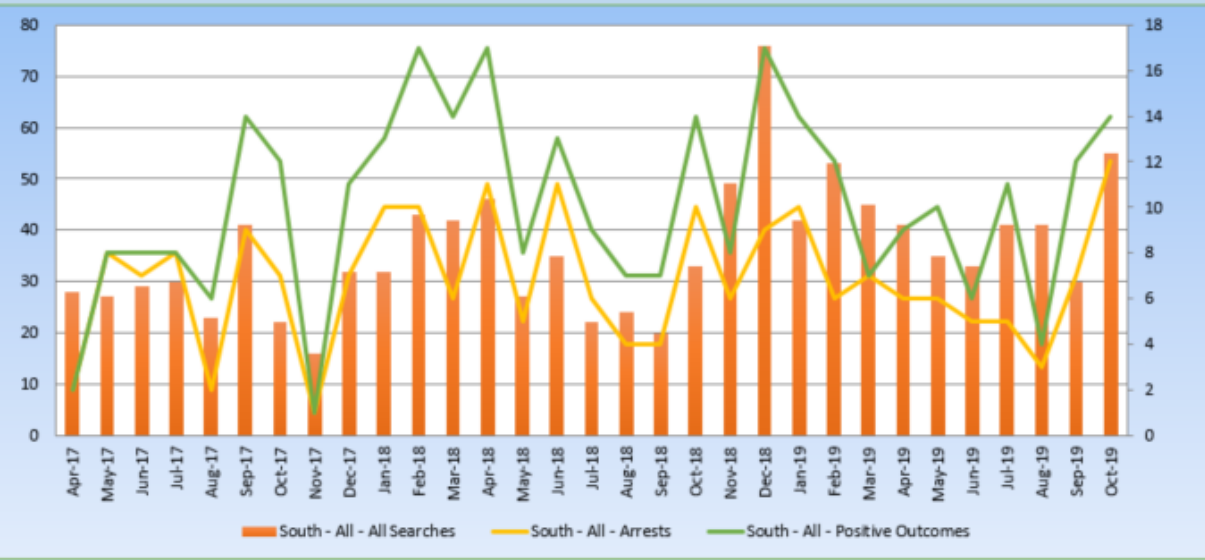

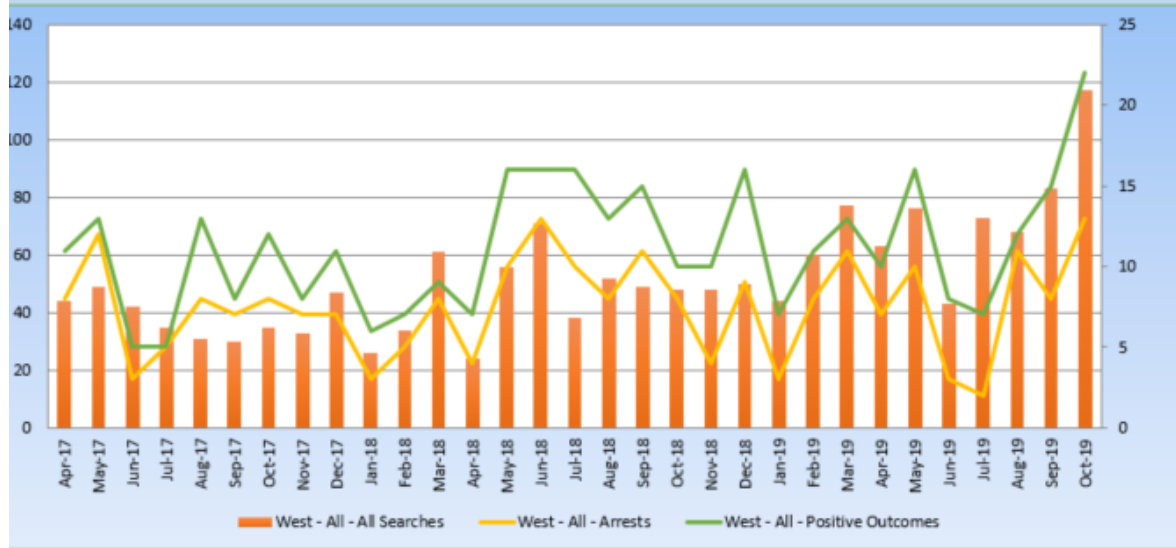

Compliance and Body worn video

The BIU continue to monitor compliance regarding legitimacy of the search and grounds for searching. The compliance rate been consistently high at 96% in August 2019, 97% in September and more recently 99.5% in October 2019.

They are also monitoring the use of body worn video during searches. The data for the previous three months is good. We have seen compliance rates continuing to remain high, over 96% across the constabulary.

There has been a significant increase in the use of body worn video with improvements from 48% in August 2019 up to 83% in October 2019.

This continues to be monitored by the BIU and feedback is provided.

The data shows no significant trends in relation to ethnicity.

It shows that in 2019/20 FYTD we have searched 52 more young people (under 18) than the previous year.

The positive outcome rate has decreased from 24% to 20%.

The highest number of young people were searched in the West TPA, their figures almost double the other areas. This correlates with the other data which shows West TPA has almost double to total number of searches across the constabulary.
