FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST – FOI 1551/25 Collisions with Civilians

I refer to your request for information which was received by Cumbria Constabulary on 27th November 2025. I note you seek access to the following information:

1) *Please could you give me the number of collisions with pedestrians per calendar year and the total, divided into damage only and personal injury (fatal/serious/slight).*

2) *Please also give me the number of collisions with civilian vehicles (bicycles/cars/etc) per calendar year and the total, divided into damage only and personal injury (fatal/serious/slight).*

For 2025, please give the data for 2025 so far (January-November).

Your request for information has now been considered, and I can confirm Cumbria Constabulary does hold some information relevant to your request and where this is the case I have today decided to disclose this to you.

Please note: the information provided has been extracted from Cumbria Constabulary's incident recording system. We can only provide data from 2019 onwards.

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Question 2)

Data relating to what kind of vehicle a collision is with such as civilian or police etc. is not held. The information is not detailed down to that level when recording collision data therefore the response to this question is no information held.

Police forces in the United Kingdom are routinely required to provide statistics to government bodies, and the recording criteria is set nationally. However, the systems used for recording these figures are not generic, nor are the procedures used locally in capturing the data. It should be noted that for these reasons this force's response to your questions should not be used for comparison purposes with any other response you may receive.

Complaint Rights
