FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST – FOI 1313/25 Stolen Vehicles

I refer to your request for information which was received by Cumbria Constabulary on 16th September 2025. I note you seek access to the following information:

Please can you confirm how many vehicles were reported stolen in Cumbria in 2023, 2024 and 2025.

Your request for information has now been considered and I can confirm Cumbria Constabulary does hold some information relevant to your request and where this is the case I have today decided to disclose this to you.

Please note: the information provided has been extracted from Cumbria Constabulary's crime recording system. We have provided the total number of 'theft of a vehicle' crimes, not the total number of vehicles themselves as this would require a manual search of each result returned which would exceed the 'appropriate limit' of time. More than one vehicle can be recorded as stolen on a single crime.

The number of vehicle thefts in Cumbria in 2023, 2024 and 2025.

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Complaint Rights
